The new DOR building is between 7th and 8th Street on Capitol Mall - Entrance is on 8th Street - across Capital Mall from EDD and across 8th Street from SPB

We are meeting in Conference Room 169 on the first floor. The room is located behind the security desk. Just inside the front doors turn right and proceed to the security desk. You must sign in and get a visitor badge. Then proceed behind the security desk (no escort needed) to where the hallway T's, and turn right. Conference Room 169 is the last door on the right. The light rail is on either side of us (7th Street/Capitol Mall Station and 8th Street/Capitol Mall Station). There's plenty of parking but, it's not free. For the IOUCA Meetings, I used to park in the downtown mall and, after the meeting, I would go buy something and get my ticket validated. Usually I could park for free. But, it's up to you.

Special Note: On February 19th (the day of our meeting) the second leg of the Amgen Tour of California (a bicycle race) is scheduled to finish in Sacramento with a circuit race around Capitol Park.

The race requires closure of some downtown streets beginning at 9 p.m on Monday, February 18th and the closure of others from 10:00 am until 4:00 pm the day of the race.

- Starting at 9:00 pm on Monday, February 18th, city blocks will be closed on 10th Street from N to K Streets and on L Street from 9th to 11th Streets;
- 12th to 15th Streets will be open until the peak of the morning commute;
- The Capitol Garage at 10th and L Street will be closed to the public and open only to monthly parkers.
- The streets following the race route (Capitol Mall, 9th Street, N Street, 15th Street, P Street, 18th Street, and L Street) will have road closures from approximately 10:00 am to 4:00 pm and there will be NO street parking along the circuit on February 19th.

Please be sure to keep these closures in mind to minimize disruptions of your parking routine that day. Regular bus and light rail service may be impacted as well so, please be aware of any announcements that might be posted at bus/light rail stations, in the bus or light rail cars, on the television, radio or in the newspaper.
